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Summary

As the manager of the Community College of Rhode Island's website design and content, I was responsible for the website's overall look & feel, ensuring that it's designed in compliance with the latest web standards for maximum compatibility with all operating systems, devices, and screen sizes. I was also responsible for ensuring that the site met all state and federal accessibility standards and laws, as well as the college's graphic standards. I supervise the creation of templates and web graphics used within the content management system and the development of the various department, programs, and organization sub-sites.

I also oversee the development, coordination, management, and ongoing maintenance of the content on the public areas of CCRI's website and provide graphical customization of the private domains and third-party systems within the ccri.edu domains such as MyCCRI, Blackboard, and Banner.

I oversee web development training for faculty, staff, and students, including the development of tutorials in support of the college Web Content Managers. I have developed instructional guides for the development of HTML code, the production and editing of web graphics, and the use of cascading style sheets toward the goal of producing web-standards compliant websites.

As an instructor in the Computer Studies department, I have taught *Intro to Web Site Development*. In essence, a course designed to familiarize the student with the development and publication of simple World Wide Web sites. The students learn to create a website using a template, publish to a server, customize, and manage web pages and images. The students got to set up and use interactive forms on the Web, use subsites, customize tables, and add a search tool to a website. I introduce students to cascading style sheets (CSS) as a means to maximize the accessibility of their web pages by separating design from content. I teach this course using the WordPress content management system (CMS).

I have also taught courses in *Introduction to Computers* and *Basic Computing*.

I began my web design and web management career in 1997 at Bridgewater State University and Brown University before joining CCRI in 2001.

Before becoming a web designer, I was the **Director of Advertising & Marketing** for NHD Stores, Inc., Stoughton, MA, where I developed and implemented all advertising and marketing

strategies for the 33-store retail chain. I was also the **Director of Advertising** at Paperama Party Supply Stores, Hingham, MA, where I developed and executed all advertising strategies for the 16-store retail chain. I also served as Creative Director for all advertising, store openings (11), and sales promotional programs. I also developed annual and daily sales projections for the chain.

I directed in-house creative and production staff at both companies and produced all promotional content using outside creative services such as ad agencies, photography, video, and sound studios. I was the creative copywriter for radio and TV commercials and was responsible for all media and print buying.
